### **Motivation**


- Democracy is in reverse (EIU, 2024) and global peace is threatened.
- MNCs powerful and influential actors operate in nondemocratic and/or conflict-ridden areas.
- The endeavor to cultivate peace emerges as a **deliberate** and *potentially* transformative endeavor.

## **Case & Context**

The effects of cartels on Mexico's society are wellestablished (Prieto-Curiel et al., 2023):

- Cartels are the 5th largest employers in MEX
- Reducing recruitment (350/week) could substantially curtail violence and lower cartel size.

Heidelberg Institute Conflict Barometer: Drug cartels

- Intensity: limited-war (4)
- Parties: drug cartels vs. gov. vs. vigilant groups
- Item: subnational, resources

## Methodology

**Grounded theory approach** → the goal is to build theory within the field of B4P in the context of "**limited war**".


#### **Data Collection:**


- In-depth, semi-structured interviews
- Participant criteria: managing > 3 employees.

→ Sample size: 33

#### **Interviewee Demographics:**


- Male 44%; Female 56%
- Mexicans 94%;
- Age group 30-39: 47%





#### **Company Characteristics:**

- Small: 34%; Medium: 31%; Big: 25%
- HQ: National 66%; Int. 34%
- For-Profit: 94%



## Data Analysis

MAXQDA: recorded digitally, transcribed, coded

- 1<sup>st</sup> round: "Overarching" codes
- 2<sup>nd</sup> round: Codes grouped and refined
- 3<sup>rd</sup> round: Codes merged, newly introduced & updated
